The Play House is wanting to change this and we seek to encourage applications from those who are currently under-represented within our organisation and the wider Theatre Industry.

We're looking for an enthusiastic individual with a passion for leadership to join The Play House and gain the unique opportunity of being mentored by The Play House's general manager, Laura Killeen.

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With the support of Birmingham City Council's Cultural Diversity Fund, the applicant will be able to develop their own Birmingham-based artistic leadership skills, networks, and knowledge to successfully lead their own cultural activity.

As part of the placement there is a £500 training budget to use to support further learning and travel expenses are covered at a rate of £10 per day.

At the end of the opportunity, the successful applicant will be offered and supported to undertake the role of Trustee on The Play House Board, embedding the learning of this placement for the individual and enabling them to influence the artistic strategy of The Play House.





About the Role:

We have one artistic development opportunity to offer which will focus on co-constructing activity with the general manager to grow the administration and leadership skills required to run a small independent theatre company. This could include learning in marketing,

governance, financial management, leadership, developing partnerships, supporting the creation of an artistic programme and fundraising.

To join us, we would expect you to be:

- Actively interested in young people's engagement with the arts and/or cultural activity within Birmingham and be able to clearly demonstrate this.
- A competent user of Microsoft Office (Word, Excel etc.)
- Enthusiastic, proactive, and reliable.
- Self-sufficient with the ability to prioritise your day and work to deadlines.
- Good interpersonal, communication and organisational skills.
- A strong commitment to working as part of a team, collaboration, sharing knowledge and enjoy interacting with a wide range of people.
